## 1 Sola by Avani

The cupboards and drawers of Avani's latest system work with or without surface hardware for a kitchen that's sleek yet fully functional. Some of the best features of Sola are hidden: interiors that are free of line boring, and sliding islands and cooktop covers that hide functional elements when not in use. ## 2 Frame by Snaidero

Italian architect Massimo Iosa Ghini was mindful of his impact on the environment when he created this kitchen for Snaidero, which uses minimal raw materials. Frame is an industrial-chic system characterized by brushed stainless-steel scaffolding that supports and frames the cupboards and extractor hood, for a design that is unexpectedly light and airy. ## 3 Unica by Downsview

The transitional look of Unica – which blends contemporary door styles with classic finishes – is designed for a fresh appearance that fits in with modern houses. Because the cabinetry is made-to-order, the selection of colours and finishes is endless; here, wire-brushed white oak is paired with milk glaze-painted panels in a custom hue. ## 4 Carattere by Scavolini

The traditional large-frame doors, updated here by Vuesse Design Studio for a contemporary effect, are Carattere's signature move and come with either visible handles or built-in grips. They feature a rough matte-lacquered surface, and the full-height LED-lit pantries are slender enough to fit comfortably in compact condo spaces.
